Haskell CISD Student Acceptable Use Policy (AUP)

Note: This acceptable use policy is separate from the G Suite for Education permission form that must be signed.

Haskell CISD provides technology to support teaching, enhance learning, and improve productivity. All Haskell CISD students are required to comply with the rules and provisions stated. The use of technology at Haskell CISD is a privilege, not a right. Students are responsible for their conduct when using any Haskell CISD technology. Staff must supervise student use of technology at all times.

Definitions

As defined in this policy, the term technology includes, but is not limited to:

- All computers -- desktops, laptops, macbooks, chromebooks, iPads -- any internet capable device
- Printers, scanners, peripheral equipment
- G Suite for Education tools and applications
- Networks (wired or wireless)
- Internet resources, texting, instant messaging, including production of Web content, all forms of Web-based synchronous and asynchronous communication including electronic mail, and file transfer protocol
- · Multimedia, video, laser, cable tv, telephone, and fax equipment
- Language lab equipment
- Software and files, including all user files generated from the use of the resources listed above
- All supplies used to maintain technology

Technology Use All Grades (Videoconferencing)

I understand that in an interactive television environment, including but not limited to, distance learning, virtual field trips and videoconferencing, my child's voice, physical presence and participation in activities will be transmitted to distance sites. I hereby agree that my child's voice, physical presence and participation in these activities will not be a violation of personal rights and hereby release any claims for the use of such during the duration of the interactive television activity.

Technology Use Grades 4-12 (All other technology usage)

Before students will be allowed to use any of the district's technology, parents/guardians of all students must sign and return the Acceptable Use Policy at the start of each school year. Students in grades 4 through 12 must also sign. Signature indicates understanding of this policy, and acceptance of liability for damages resulting from the intentional disregard of this policy. Students in grades 4-12 may not log in to anything under another student's account or a generic account unless there is an extenuating circumstance and only with teacher permission. Staff will enforce this policy. Students who have not returned the appropriately signed Acceptable Use Policy will not be permitted to use the Haskell CISD's technology.

Internet Use All Grades

The internet contains a rich collection of educational resources which can enrich and extend instruction. Because it is an unregulated worldwide medium constantly growing and changing, it is the responsibility of Haskell CISD to ensure that students make use of this resource safely and responsibly. I understand that it is impossible for Haskell CISD to restrict access to all controversial materials found on electronic networks and I will not hold Haskell CISD responsible for material acquired on the network and internet.

Haskell CISD uses an internet content filter that is compliant with the Child Internet Protection Act (CIPA), in that it blocks material that is obscene, pornographic, and in any way harmful to minors. All use of the internet is monitored.

Each student must take responsibility for his/her actions online. Any attempt of the following will result in immediate revocation of technology privileges as well as possible disciplinary and/or legal action.

- Visit inappropriate web content
- Download files with HCISD equipment (unless permitted by the teacher)
- Upload files to a site not approved by Haskell CISD
- · Communicate with anyone in an inappropriate, harassing or threatening manner, or
- Send or receive any message that indicates or suggests pornography, unethical or illegal solicitation, racism, sexism, inappropriate language

Technology Code of Ethics

- Students should respect Haskell CISD's property. All technology is the property of Haskell CISD. No one is to move, damage
 or tamper with the district's technology.
- Students should use technology for school-related, educational activities only. Any other use must be with teacher permission only.

- Students should be courteous and use appropriate language. Do not harass, threaten or attack others, or use expressions of bigotry, racism, and/or hate. Do not send, display, or use profanity or obscene, explicit or offensive material.
- Students should protect their privacy and safety by not disclosing personal information such as your telephone number, address, location or password. Use only the password assigned to you. You are not allowed to use anyone else's username or password to access any Haskell CISD technology. Students will be held responsible for activity on their account.
- Students should recognize and respect the intellectual property of others, including work and materials found online. Students should not attempt to view, seek, obtain, or modify information, or data or passwords belonging to other users.
- Students should adhere to Federal copyright laws and publisher's licensing agreements.
- Never install or try to install any software/program/app without prior teacher approval first.
- Do not attempt to install software or download files for non-school related purposes using Haskell CISD technology.
- The buying/selling of goods is not allowed.

Violations of the Technology Code of Ethics

- No food or drink should be consumed close to Haskell CISD technology.
- Students should respect the integrity of the HCISD network. Do not attempt to circumvent or disable security measures
 including internet filtering methods.
- Students should report user misconduct, suspected viruses, and technical problems to the teacher immediately so that action can be taken to minimize possible damage to technology.
- Students should notify their teacher or other school personnel when they come across information or messages that are dangerous, inappropriate, or make them feel uncomfortable.
- Students should use technology responsibly. Consider the needs of others when using shared or networked computers, printers or other technological resources.

Violations of the HCISD Technology Code of Ethics may result in loss of technology access, disciplinary and/or legal action, including any resulting financial liability.

To parents and guardians,

At HCISD, we have been using G Suite for Education for several years. Google requests that we notify all parents and obtain permission each school year. We are not doing anything new this year other than providing you with this documentation and obtaining your written permission.

HCISD is seeking your permission to provide and manage a G Suite for Education account for your child. G Suite for Education is a set of education productivity tools from Google including Gmail, Calendar, Docs, Sheets, Forms, Classroom, and more used by tens of millions of students and teachers around the world. The account username will use their first and last initial and their HCISD student ID number and look like an email address -- fl0000@haskell.esc14.net for example. With this account, your student will have access to software that is available anywhere they log in using their school account -- at school, home or work. The account and tools are free to all students of HCISD.

At HCISD, students will use their G Suite accounts to complete assignments, communicate with their teachers, sign in to their Chromebooks, and learn 21st-century digital citizenship skills. The student's account lets them access the G Suite tools, but these tools can be restricted. For instance, the use of Gmail is outlined below:

- <u>Grades 9-12</u> will have open email -- they will be able to send and receive email from anyone. This
 allows them to use their school email for dual credit classes and in communication with post-secondary
 institutions. The email will be closely monitored and filtered for inappropriate language and content.
 Failure to abide by the district's Acceptable Use Policy will result in the student's email being closed.
- Grades 6-8 will have restricted email -- they will only be able to send and receive email to people with a
 haskell.esc14.net address. This email will be closely monitored and filtered for inappropriate language
 and content. Failure to abide by the district's Acceptable Use Policy will result in the student's email
 being closed.
- Grade 5 and below will have email addresses but only for the purpose of using Google services such as Chrome, Docs, etc for school use. They will not have access to email.

The GSuite for Education Notice to Parents and Guardians provides answers to common questions about what Google can and can't do with your child's personal information. This document can be found on the school website at www.haskell.esc14.net. Please read it carefully, let us know of any questions, and then sign below to indicate that you've read the notice and give your consent. If you don't provide your consent, we will not create a G Suite for Education account for your child. However, students who cannot use Google services will be required to complete their assignments using pen and paper.

G Suite for Education Notice to Parents and Guardians

This notice describes the personal information we provide to Google for these accounts and how Google collects, uses, and discloses personal information from students in connection with these accounts.

Blogger and various extensions and apps that enhance the services above -- such as a grammar checker, .pdf enhancer, etc.

Google provides information about the information it collects, as well as how it uses and discloses the information it collects from G Suite for Education accounts in its G Suite for Education Privacy Notice. You can read that notice online at https://gsuite.google.com/terms/education_privacy.html You should review this information in its entirety, but below are answers to some common questions:

What personal information does Google collect?

When creating a student account, HCISD may provide Google with certain personal information about the student, including, for example, a name, email address, and password. Google may also collect personal information directly from students, such as telephone number for account recovery or a profile photo added to the G Suite for Education account.

When a student uses Google services, Google also collects information based on the use of those services. This includes:

- device information, such as the hardware model, operating system version, unique device identifiers, and mobile network information including phone number;
- log information, including details of how a user used Google services, device event information, and the user's Internet protocol (IP) address;
- location information, as determined by various technologies including IP address, GPS, and other sensors;
- unique application numbers, such as application version number; and
- cookies or similar technologies which are used to collect and store information about a browser or device, such as preferred language and other settings.

How does Google use this information?

In G Suite for Education Core Services, Google uses student personal information to provide, maintain, and protect the services. Google does not serve ads in the Core Services or use personal information collected in the Core Services for advertising purposes.

In Google Additional Services, Google uses the information collected from all Additional Services to provide, maintain, protect and improve them, to develop new ones, and to protect Google and its users. Google may also use this information to offer tailored content, such as more relevant search results. Google may combine personal information from one service with information, including personal information, from other Google services.

Does Google use student personal information for users in K-12 schools to target advertising?

No. For G Suite for Education users in primary and secondary (K-12) schools, Google does not use any user personal information (or any information associated with an G Suite for Education Account) to target ads, whether in Core Services or in other Additional Services accessed while using an G Suite for Education account.

Can my child share information with others using the G Suite for Education account?

Students at Haskell JH and Elem are only allowed to share information within the HCISD domain. This includes email. Students at Haskell HS are allowed to share information outside the HCISD domain including email.

Will Google disclose my child's personal information?

Google will not share personal information with companies, organizations and individuals outside of Google unless one of the following circumstances applies:

- With parental or guardian consent. Google will share personal information with companies, organizations or individuals outside of Google when it has parents' consent (for users below the age of consent), which may be obtained through G Suite for Education schools.
- With HCISD G Suite for Education accounts, because they are school-managed accounts, give administrators
 access to information stored in them.
- For external processing. Google may provide personal information to affiliates or other trusted businesses or persons to process it for Google, based on Google's instructions and in compliance with the G Suite for Education privacy notice and any other appropriate confidentiality and security measures.
- For legal reasons. Google will share personal information with companies, organizations or individuals outside of Google if it has a good-faith belief that access, use, preservation or disclosure of the information is reasonably necessary to:
 - meet any applicable law, regulation, legal process or enforceable governmental request.
 - enforce applicable Terms of Service, including investigation of potential violations.
 - detect, prevent, or otherwise address fraud, security or technical issues.
 - protect against harm to the rights, property or safety of Google, Google users or the public as required or permitted by law.

Google also shares non-personal information -- such as trends about the use of its services -- publicly and with its partners.

What choices do I have as a parent or guardian?

First, you can consent to the collection and use of your child's information by Google. If you don't provide your consent, we will not create a G Suite for Education account for your child, and Google will not collect or use your child's information as described in this notice.

If you consent to your child's use of G Suite for Education, you can access or request deletion of your child's G Suite for Education account by contacting **Amanda Hadaway at 940.864.8535 ext 297**. If you wish to stop any further collection or use of your child's information, you can request that we use the service controls available to limit your child's access to features or services, or delete your child's account entirely. You and your child can also visit https://myaccount.google.com while signed in to the G Suite for Education account to view and manage the personal information and settings of the account.
